VII. A TESTIMONY - A NEW YOU - A SOUL AWAKENING JOURNEY- WHERE THE SOUL ROSE ANEW;

MY DEAR READERS, I am honoured to share my soul awakening journey with you, how my personal experiences became lessons that guided me from my *old self into the birth of my new self*. It reflects an immense soul transformation that unfolds my true identity.

When I was 15 years old, something shifted deep within me. A DIVINE ASSIGNMENT.

Then came a defining moment, God used my wisdom and medical knowledge to help save the life of a young boy named **Sunny**, only 23 years old and on the edge of death. For Sunny's betterment and survival, we decided to shift him from the peripheral hospital to an advanced hospital where he could receive higher-level care.

But the doctors advised against transferring him, saying it was too risky for a ventilated patient. However, as family members, we decided to proceed with the transfer, despite it being a risky and potentially life-threatening decision. Because we, as a family, reasoned that the doctors had already given up, saying there was no hope left. With nothing more to lose, we chose to take the risk, placing our trust in the Almighty.

During the ambulance transfer, midway between the peripheral hospital and the advanced hospital, after a 1 and a half hours of journey, Sunny suddenly became restless. When we noticed his restlessness and deterioration, **we immediately began CPR.**

Every vital sign on the monitor dropped to zero. At that moment, I felt like the end. Panic filled the Ambulance. Silence replaced the beeping machines. Time froze. The paramedics and I stared at the monitor, flat lines, zero vitals, no pulse, no breath. **Someone whispered, “He’s gone.”**

In that confined space between earth and eternity, human effort had ended. Everything seemed finished, no hope, no solutions, no direction, no clarity about what to do next. Yet, in the midst of human limitation, **God remained sovereign.** He knew what we could not - He knew the way when we saw none.

I closed my eyes. My hands trembled. My heart cried out not in words, but in surrender. “God... this cannot be the end.” And in that moment of utter helplessness, I felt His presence descend **not loud, not dramatic, but powerful, undeniable, alive.** I placed my hand on Sunny’s chest and whispered a prayer that came from my soul, **“Lord, breathe Your life into him again.”**

In that sacred space where **despair met surrender, faith arose stronger than fear.** It was as if Heaven whispered, ***“Be still -I am here.”*** And in that very moment, something shifted. The atmosphere changed. The air felt heavy, sacred. **What was medically impossible became spiritually inevitable.**

Seconds passed like eternity. Then a flicker on the screen. A faint line. A weak pulse. A gasp. The monitor beeped. Life returned. Tears streamed down my face as hope broke through despair. Every step, every second, every outcome was aligned by Heaven. That moment was not a coincidence - it was divine confirmation. What medicine and human effort could not do, grace had done. That ambulance became an altar. That moment became a testimony.

Slowly, signs of life returned. Breath strengthened. Hope awakened.

What once looked like an ending transformed into a testimony. It became clear that this was not just about saving a life -it was about **revealing the hand of God,** and then, at last, the moment drew near- Sunny was freed from the ventilator’s hold. For the very first time, his voice I could hear, soft yet alive, courageous and bold.

“I saw you,” he (Sunny) said, “beyond mortal sight -not with these eyes, but in spirit-light. When life was fading, almost gone, you were there... helping me hold on.”

SUNNY’S SURVIVAL WASN’T MERELY A RECOVERY – IT WAS A MIRACLE.

That day, I didn’t just witness healing; I witnessed God’s glory- and I shook in fear, Heaven felt heavy, unbearably near.

Earth could not hold what my spirit had seen. I stood undone between worlds unseen. The sky cried out, the wild winds screamed, as if all creation knew what it meant. I. A. THE TRINITY: ONE GOD, IN THREE

***Knowing God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit -To
understand the unity, roles, and relationship of the
Trinity in our lives.***

The Trinity is not three gods, but **One God in three forms** - the **Father**, the **Son (Jesus)**, and the **Holy Spirit**. Each one is **fully God**, and yet there is only **one God**. **The Father is the Creator, the Son is the Saviour, and the Holy Spirit is the Helper**. Together, they work in perfect harmony to **guide, love, save, and dwell within us**.

God, the Father, invites you into His eternal family. **God, the Son**, laid down His life so you could be saved. **God, the Holy Spirit**, lives in you to comfort and empower you daily. The Trinity is not a puzzle to be solved but a mystery to be embraced. When you trust in this **relationship**, you will experience **God's fullness**.

Let's pray together to invite his presence.

My Heavenly Father, thank you for your **deep love**. **Jesus**, thank You for **saving me**. **Holy Spirit**, thank You for **guiding me**. O my **triune** God: Teach me to walk closely with You and fully understand You. Help me reflect Your **unity, love, and truth** in all that I do. I open my heart to Your presence today, and I invite You to intertwine in my life, renewing me in all aspects. **Amen**.

CHAPTER 1.

UNDERSTANDING THE TRINITY WITH EXAMPLES:

1. Example: The Trinity Explained Using an Apple.

Think of an **apple**. It has three parts: **The Skin** is what we see and touch. **The flesh** is what we eat. **The Core/Seed** is what reproduces life. All three parts make **one apple** different in form, but one in essence.

Likewise, God the Father is like the **core**, the source of all life. **God, the Son (Jesus)**, is like the **flesh**, who became human and was seen, touched, and experienced. **God, the Holy Spirit**, is like the **skin** surrounding us, guiding, protecting, and helping us daily.

*“Each is distinct, but they are not separate gods.
Together, they are one God, unified, perfect, and
complete.”*

2. Example: Trinity Explained Using Water.

Water can exist in three forms: **ice** (solid), **liquid** water (flowing), and **steam** (vapour). They all have the same essence: **H₂O (Water)**. They look and feel different, but they are one substance.

Likewise, God the Father is like **ice**- strong, foundational, unchanging, and the solid support of our faith. **God the Son (Jesus)** is like liquid water - who came to the earth and moved among people, refreshing lives and healing hearts, and **God the Holy Spirit** is like **steam** - unseen but present,

filling the space around us with power, warmth, and guidance.

All three are different forms, but the same God, just like H₂O is still water whether solid, liquid, or vapour.

3. Example: Trinity Explained Using the Sun.

The **Sun** is one source, yet it reveals itself in **three distinct ways**: **Light**- We see it. **Heat**- We feel it. **Energy**- It gives life and power. All three come from **one Sun**, and yet they serve different roles.

Likewise, God the Father is like the **Sun itself**, the source of all life and existence, powerful and radiant. **God the Son (Jesus)** is like the **light** visible, bringing clarity, direction, and truth into the world (John 8:12). **God the Holy Spirit** is like the **heat or energy** felt in our hearts, empowering, comforting, and moving through us.

“May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ (Son), the love of God (Father), and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.”- 2 Corinthians 13:14

CHAPTER 2.

THE TRINITY: ONE GOD - MANIFESTED IN THREE FORMS - THE FATHER, THE SON, & THE HOLY SPIRIT.

This profound concept in Christian theology suggests a unity in diversity, where each aspect of the Trinity is distinct yet inseparable, embodying distinct roles and attributes.

This triune nature of **God mirrors the complexity of human identity**. Just as the Trinity encompasses diverse aspects within a single divine essence, individuals are composed of multiple layers of emotion, spirit, and intellect, each contributing to the fullness of who we are as humans. (Mind, body, and spirit- A divine alignment.)

Embracing this complexity allows one to appreciate the **interconnectedness** of various facets of identity, leading to a more profound **understanding of oneself and one's relationship with the divine**.

In this light, exploring the question “**Who are you truly?**” becomes an invitation to recognise the **divine spark within**, honouring both the **unique individuality** and the shared **humanity** that bind us all.

Mind -Body- Spirit- A Divine Alignment.

*We are living beings, created with a divine design —
mind, body, and spirit.*

Let's Understand -A Divine Alignment: Without the spirit, the body is nothing more than a silent, motionless form. **Without the mind**, both the body and spirit cannot

express purpose, direction, or understanding. And **without the body**, the mind and spirit cannot function in this earthly realm. Each part depends on the other. **The spirit gives life, the mind gives meaning, and the body gives expression.**

“When all three are aligned, we live as God intended - whole, conscious, purposeful, and spiritually awakened.”

But when even one of these three is out of balance, the entire being becomes unsettled. When the **spirit is weak**, life feels **empty**. When the **mind is confused**, direction is **lost**. When the **body is undisciplined**, purpose becomes **difficult** to fulfil.

“Harmony comes only when the spirit leads, the mind obeys, and the body follows.”

“This divine order brings clarity and peace, strength to endure, and alignment that frees. In this holy rhythm, we don’t just survive - we awaken in truth, we truly live alive. We become vessels of light, His essence we bear, carriers of heaven, His purpose we share. On earth we are chosen, His instruments true, living His will in all that we do.”

CHAPTER 3.

IMPORTANCE OF THE TRINITY IN CHRISTIAN FAITH.

1. **Reveals the Nature of God: The Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit)** shows us that God is not distant or impersonal but a living relationship of love. God is one in essence but three in personhood, showing unity in diversity.

“May they be one as we are one.” (John 17:21)

“But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, He will teach you all things.” (John 14:26)

In short, the Trinity is the heart of Christian faith. It explains *who God is, how He works in us, and why we live in love, forgiveness, and unity.*

CHAPTER 4.

FROM OLD -SELF TO NEW YOU: WHY KNOWING THE TRINITY CHANGES EVERYTHING?

A testimony; As I spent many years searching for the true God - walking through the rituals, traditions, and practices of different religions, trying to understand with my mind what my spirit had already begun to feel. *For “deep calls to deep” (Psalm 42:7),* and something within me was calling **His name**.

And then, *I received Christ as my Saviour and Redeemer.* From that moment, the Scriptures of the Bible became my daily breath, my silent companion, my living conversation with Heaven. *“In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God” (John 1:1).* And suddenly, the **Word** was alive within me.

I sought to know why humanity fell away from God, as revealed in **Genesis 3:9**, “*Where are you?*”, the cry of a Father searching for His lost child. And how we are restored by grace through God the Son, as proclaimed in **Romans 5:8**-
“*While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.*”

I searched to understand why we carry burdens in this world, why sorrow shadows our steps, and how we can be freed from pain, heaviness, and despair. And as I searched for truth through the gentle leading of the Holy Spirit, as it says in **(John 16:13)** “*When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all truth*” - a calling was born within me.

I. B. GOD THE FATHER: THE LIGHT OF LIFE- THE SOURCE OF ALL CREATION.

God the Father is the Source of all life, the Origin of love, and the Eternal Beginning of everything seen and unseen. He is not created, not confined, and not limited by time, space, or human understanding. Before identity, before purpose, before transformation - there is the Father.

CHAPTER 2.

THE ETERNAL FATHER: BEYOND BIRTH, DEATH, AND KARMA.

The **Almighty Father**, the first part of the Trinity, stands above the cycle of birth and death, untouched by the bondage of karma and the longing for spiritual liberation. He **is eternal, uncreated, undistractable, and unchanging**, the pure source of all life and being.

“Before the mountains were born or You brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting You are God.” — Psalm 90:2

The Almighty Father is not like us. He did not die, and **He was never born**. He is not in the cycle of karma or time. He is **outside of it all, pure light, pure presence, pure life**. His being cannot be grasped by physical eyes or human intellect.

Yet, **He is not far away**. He sent His Son (Jesus) to reveal His nature and poured out His Spirit (Holy Spirit) so that we might experience Him. He is the Father who adopts us into His eternal family, not by our works or striving, but by His grace and love.

We cannot **see** Him, but we can **know** Him. Every moment of peace, every whisper of truth, every moment of conviction or comfort -that's His presence. He does not need to be chased. He is already near. Human experiences do not bind him; he is a light, the source of life, and we have to experience him.

Let's explore God the Father more closely.

When we **find courage** in the face of fear, it is **His assurance** bolstering our spirits. When we **experience forgiveness** and a **sense of release**, it is **His mercy** washing over us. When we are moved to **acts of compassion**, it is **His heart** guiding our actions.

When we are **inspired** to create and share beauty, it is **His creativity** flowing through us. When we feel **a deep sense of belonging**, it is **His acceptance** that embraces us. When we discover **resilience** in the midst of adversity, it is **His faithfulness** anchoring us.

When we **perceive beauty** in the mundane, it is **His wonder** awakening our senses. When we feel **a call to uplift and serve others**, it is **His purpose** resonating within us. When we **experience healing**, whether physical, emotional, or spiritual, it is **His touch** restoring us.

When we **encounter** unexpected opportunities, it is **His providence** opening doors. When we **seek and find truth**, it is **His light** guiding our understanding. When we **foster connections** that transcend differences, it is **His unity** drawing us together. When we **experience** moments of clarity amidst confusion, it is **His wisdom** unravelling the knots.

And so on and on.....

“The Spirit Himself testifies with our spirit that we are God’s children.” - Romans 8:16

Each of these moments is a gentle reminder of the Divine's active presence in our lives, weaving threads of **love, strength, and wisdom** into the fabric of our everyday experiences; calling us to **pause and acknowledge the sacred, often hidden, miracles that surround us.**

These **divine encounters** invite us to live with **gratitude and mindfulness**, aware of the unseen forces that shape our journey. Self-Reflection:

CHAPTER 3.

GOD THE FATHER: OUR ORIGIN & RELATIONSHIP WITH HIM.

“The Father, as the source and heart of the Trinity, represents the beginning of all creation and the essence of unconditional love.”

He is the architect of the universe, whose wisdom and power set the cosmos into motion. In our relationship with the Father, we find a profound sense of belonging and purpose, anchored in His infinite love and grace. Let’s explore more about our origin and relationship with the Father,

1. The Fatherhood of God

- The term **“Father”** is more than a metaphor; it expresses **the eternal relationship** within the Trinity.

- Unlike human fathers, God the Father is **perfect, eternal, and loving**.
- God is not “like” a father -**He is the ultimate Father**.

heart-to-heart with the Father of your soul.*

*who loves you beyond all measure and time, with a
love eternal, holy, and divine.*

Understanding Your Divine Intimate Relationship With Almighty God, The Father.

“The Almighty Father is not distant. He desires deep connection; not only as God, but as a friend, teacher, lover, and parent. In every season, He meets you in the role your soul most needs.”

1. As a Father: Source & Protector: He birthed you in Spirit. He knows your soul deeply.

“I will be a Father to you, and you shall be My sons and daughters.” — 2 Corinthians 6:18

When to relate this way: When you seek **comfort, guidance, protection, and belonging.**

2. As a Friend: Companion & Listener: He walks with you. No masks needed. No judgment.

5. As a Parent: Discipline & Nourishment. He disciplines not to punish but to help you bloom.

6. As a Child: When You Need to Let Go. Sometimes you don’t need to do more. You need to be **held**.

CHAPTER 5.

A FATHER WHO LISTENS! - ASK, SEEK, AND KNOCK

God the Father never turns away from the cries of His children. He delights when you come to Him with childlike trust, *asking, seeking, and knocking with faith*. Just as a loving parent responds to their child's needs, so does your Heavenly Father respond to yours.

“Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you.” —

Matthew 7:7

This verse beautifully affirms the *open-hearted relationship*. God, the Heavenly Father, wants to be with us - one of **trust, communication, and faith**.

- When you *ask*, you express your **faith**.
- When you *seek*, you show your desire to **grow closer to Him**.
- When you *knock*, you take action in trust - **knowing the door of His grace will open in perfect time**.

His love does not delay. Sometimes the answers come in silence, sometimes in peace, and sometimes in transformation -but His response is always rooted in perfect wisdom and care.

Reflection Question:

What am I seeking from God today: a healing, a complete restoration, a total transformation, or simply his divine presence?

How can I trust His divine timing more deeply?

Write down one Christlike trait you want to show more of this week (e.g., compassion, humility, boldness, forgiveness).

Prayer: My Heavenly Father, thank You for hearing me even when words fail. Help me to ask with faith, seek with patience, and knock with courage, trusting that You always open the right doors in my life. **Amen.**

Affirmation: I come before my Heavenly Father with faith and trust. When I ask, He listens. When I seek, He reveals the truth. When I knock, He opens the way. My Father is near, attentive to my prayers, guiding me with love, wisdom, and grace. In Him, my heart finds peace and assurance.

CHAPTER 6.

GOD THE FATHER REVEALED HIMSELF THROUGH JESUS — “I AM.”

God the Father has always desired to be **known**, not merely believed in. Yet humanity struggled to understand Him- distant, invisible, eternal, beyond human reach. So God did not remain hidden. **He revealed Himself.**

He revealed Himself through Jesus.

When Jesus spoke the words “**I AM**,” He was not only identifying Himself- He was unveiling **the Father’s nature, authority, and eternal identity.**

“Before Abraham was born, I AM.” — John 8:58

With these words, Jesus echoed the sacred name God revealed to Moses:

“I AM WHO I AM.” — Exodus 3:14

This was not a coincidence. It was a **revelation.**

1. “I AM” -The Eternal Name of the Father: When God spoke to Moses from the burning bush, He did not give a descriptive name. He revealed **His being.**

“I AM” means:

- Self-existent
- Eternal
- Unchanging
- Indestructible.
- Ever-present

- Dependent on nothing

By using **“I AM,”** Jesus was declaring that **the same eternal Father was now speaking in human form.**

“Anyone who has seen Me has seen the Father.” — John 14:9

Jesus did not replace the Father -He **revealed** Him.

2. The Father Was Invisible - Jesus Made Him Visible:

God the Father is Spirit.

“No one has ever seen God.” — John 1:18

Human eyes could not perceive Him. Human minds could not fully understand Him. So the Father expressed Himself through the Son.

“The Word became flesh and dwelt among us.” — John 1:14

Through Jesus, the Father became:

- Approachable
- Understandable
- Relational
- Visible through love, compassion, and truth

Jesus was not merely speaking *about* God - He was **God revealing Himself.**

3. The “I AM” Statements - The Father’s Nature Revealed: Each **“I AM”** statement in the Gospel of John reveals **who the Father is and how He meets human need.**

- **I AM the Bread of Life** → The Father is our sustainer
- **I AM the Light of the World** → The Father is our truth
- **I AM the Door** → The Father is our access
- **I AM the Good Shepherd** → The Father is our protector
- **I AM the Resurrection and the Life** → The Father is our victory
- **I AM the Way, the Truth, and the Life** → The Father is our only path
- **I AM the True Vine** → The Father is our source

Jesus did not say, "I will show you the way." He said, "I AM."

Everything humanity seeks in God - provision, guidance, forgiveness, life - is found **fully in Christ**, because **Christ reveals the Father**.

4. "I AM" Breaks the Illusion of Separation: Sin caused humanity to see God as distant. Religion increased fear. Tradition created barriers. But when Jesus said **"I AM,"** He removed the distance.

"I AM" means:

- God is present, not absent
- God is now, not later
- God is near, not far

"The Kingdom of God is at hand." — Mark 1:15

The Father did not wait for humanity to climb toward Him.
He came down.

5. From Knowing About God to Knowing God: Moving from *knowing about God* to *knowing God* implies shifting from intellectual, theological, or distant information to a personal, intimate, and experiential relationship through Jesus Christ. **Before Jesus**, people knew *about* God. **Through Jesus**, people **knew God personally**.

They saw:

- How the Father forgives
- How the Father loves sinners
- How the Father heals the broken
- How the Father restores identity

Jesus did not just teach theology -He revealed **relationships**.

6. “I AM” and the Birth of the New You: When Jesus says “I AM,” He also speaks to **who you are becoming in Him**.

Because:

- If He is the **Bread** → you are sustained
- If He is the **Light** → you are awakened
- If He is the **Way** → you are guided
- If He is the **Vine** → you are connected
- If He is **Life** → you are reborn

The revelation of “I AM” does not end with Jesus- it transforms **you**.

“Christ in you, the hope of glory.” — Colossians 1:27

7. The Father Still Speaks “I AM”: Today, “**I AM**” is not past tense. It is a **present reality**.

The Father still says:

- ***I AM** with you*
- ***I AM** enough*
- ***I AM** your source*
- ***I AM** your peace*
- ***I AM** your life*

But the soul must listen.

SUMMARY

When God the Father wanted to be known, He did not send a message- He sent **Himself**. Jesus is the living revelation of the eternal “**I AM**.” Through Him, the Father is no longer distant, unknown, or unreachable. To know Jesus is to **know the Father**. To receive “**I AM**” is to step into a **new life**.

CHAPTER 7.

GOD THE FATHER'S INVISIBLE LOVE FLOWS THROUGH VISIBLE RELATIONSHIPS.

When You Feel Loved, You're Feeling God. Every act of love you receive, from a parent, a friend, or even a stranger, is a reflection of God's heart reaching you through human form. When someone comforts you without judgment, encourages you when you're low, or simply stands beside you in silence, that's God's invisible hand made visible.

The Almighty Father expresses His presence not always in **thunder or miracles**, but in the gentle gestures that touch your soul. **Love, kindness, patience, guidance** - these are all currents of His divine energy flowing through the people He places in your path.

“God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in them.” — 1 John 4:16

When your mother prays for you, it's His protection. When a friend listens to you, it's His compassion. When a stranger helps you, it's His guidance in disguise. The Father's love surrounds you constantly, not only in **spiritual experiences** but in the **ordinary moments** where heaven quietly touches earth where you live.

from Heaven's heart? It is the fallen nature, silent yet
strong, that bends our will, that leads us wrong.*

*A separation born of fear and pride, that veils the

to divide - they are doors where truth resides.*

heaven's intervention, clear and right.*

CHAPTER 1.

WHO IS THE GOD THE SON (JESUS CHRIST): THE VISIBLE IMAGE OF THE INVISIBLE GOD.

“The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.”- Colossians 1:15 (NIV)

(Memory Tip: Picture Jesus as the mirror in which we see the Father's heart.)

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is not just a great teacher or prophet. He is **God in human form**. Through Him, **the invisible God becomes visible**. He walked among us, full of grace and truth, showing us the heart of the Father.

“For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.” - John 3:16

The **Son** is eternally one with the **Father**, yet He humbled Himself **to enter time, to suffer, to die, and to rise again not for His sake, but for ours**. Through Him, we see what **perfect love, perfect obedience, and perfect truth look like in human form**.

When we look at **Jesus**, we see the **Father's love in action**, the **Spirit's power flowing**, and the **way back to eternal life**.

“Jesus is the bridge between the divine and the human -our Saviour, our Lord, and our brother.”

He is the **bridge** between God and mankind- the one who takes away our guilt and fills us with grace. Through Him, we experience **forgiveness, healing, and freedom from spiritual death**. *When I say, Spiritual Death I mean*

Separation from the Source of Life, light, and divine love. It's a complete loss of our privilege to enjoy God's Divinity and Power.

***“In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace.” -
Ephesians 1:7***

Jesus Christ is **God the Son**, the visible image of the invisible God - the one who came to Earth in human form to **redeem, restore, and reconcile** humanity with the **Father**.

“For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost.” — Luke 19:10

“Through His life, death, and resurrection, He broke the power of sin and gave eternal life to all who believe.”

Reflection Questions:

What does it mean to you that Jesus is the image of the invisible God?

How does the life of Jesus help you understand the Father's character more clearly?

In what ways can you reflect Jesus in your daily life?

Activity: “Mirror Moment”

- Stand in front of a mirror and reflect silently:

CHAPTER 2.

GOD THE SON (JESUS CHRIST): THE BRIDGE BETWEEN THE OLD SELF & THE NEW LIFE.

Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is the divine bridge that connects humanity's fallen nature to the redeemed life in God. Through His sacrifice, He broke the chains of sin and opened the way for *spiritual rebirth -from darkness into light, from bondage into freedom, and from death into eternal life.*

He is the **pathway of transformation** -guiding us to leave behind the *old self* -filled with guilt, pain, and fear, and to walk in the *newness* of grace, truth, and divine purpose.

For Oldself: "For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God." - Colossians 3:3

For Newness: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" — 2 Corinthians 5:17.

CHAPTER 5.

WHY DID GOD THE FATHER COME AS GOD THE SON - JESUS CHRIST ON EARTH?

God the ***Father*** came as a ***Son*** to this earth for five divine purposes: ***Revelation, Relationship, Redemption, Guidance, and Transformation.***

1. Revelation: To Reveal His True Nature - Love in Action.

God is invisible and beyond human comprehension. But through Jesus, the Father revealed His heart in human form.

CHAPTER 6.

WHY DID JESUS BECOME THE BRIDGE BETWEEN HUMANITY AND DIVINITY (GOD)?

The Fallen Nature of Humankind: Separation from divinity.

1. The Origin of the Separation: In the beginning, God created humanity in perfect harmony with Himself - **pure, innocent, and full of divine light**. Humanity walked in an intimate relationship with God, sharing His joy and peace. But when Adam and Eve disobeyed God in the Garden of Eden, they didn't just break a rule -they **broke an intimate relationship with God the Father**. CHAPTER 7.

WHY DO PEOPLE FAIL TO BELIEVE IN GOD (IN JESUS CHRIST)?

1. Spiritual Blindness - The Eyes of the Heart Are Closed:

Many cannot see God because their *spiritual vision* is clouded by worldly distractions, pride, or pain.

“The god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel.” - 2 Corinthians 4:4

When the heart is filled with **fear, doubt, or self-dependence**, it becomes difficult to recognise the gentle whisper of the divine.

2. Intellectual Pride - Wanting to Understand Before Believing. Some people want *proof before faith*, but faith itself is the bridge to revelation.

“You say, ‘I am rich; I have everything I want. I don't need a thing! But you don't realise that you are wretched and miserable and poor and blind and naked.’ - Revelation 3:17

Faith is strongest when we realise how much we need divine grace every single day.

5. Misrepresentation of Religion: Some lose faith not because of God, but because of how people *misrepresent Him*. Religious hypocrisy, judgment, or cold traditions can make people associate God with rules instead of love.

“These people honour me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me.” - Matthew 15:8

True faith is not found in rituals, but in relationships.

6. Fear of Surrender: Believing in God requires **letting go of control** - and many fear that surrender. Faith asks us to trust the unseen, to walk where reason hesitates.

People fear that following God means losing freedom - but in truth, it's where freedom begins.

Faith is not seeing to believe - it is believing to see. When the heart opens with humility, the light of truth enters, and God reveals Himself not as an idea, but as a living presence.

CHAPTER 1.

CHAPTER 4.

CHAPTER 5.

HOW TO KNOW - AM I TRULY BEING LED BY GOD THE HOLY SPIRIT - OR BY MY OWN THOUGHTS, EMOTIONS, OR DESIRES?

A beautiful, essential question we must face, one every believer should ask in this race: How do I know whose voice I hear- the Holy Spirit's lead, or my own fear? Is it His whisper, gentle and true, or thoughts and emotions shaping my view? Is desire guiding the path I choose, or His will calling me to truth?

1. You Experience Inner Peace, Not Pressure: The Holy Spirit leads with **peace**, not panic. Even when He challenges or corrects you, there's a calm assurance that you're in God's will.

“For God is not the author of confusion but of peace.” — 1 Corinthians 14:33

Ask yourself: Does this decision or path bring me peace deep within, even if it's difficult?

2. The Word of God Confirms It: The Holy Spirit **never contradicts Scripture**. If what you feel led to do goes against God's Word, it's not the Spirit - it's self-decision or deception.

“But the Helper, the Holy Spirit... will teach you all things, and remind you of everything I have told you.” — John 14:26

Ask yourself: Does this align with what God has already said in His Word?

3. You Bear the Fruit of the Spirit: When you are led by Him, your life begins to **reflect His character (Christlikeness)**- love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

“By their fruit you will recognise them.” — Matthew 7:16

“The fruit of the Spirit is...” — Galatians 5:22–23

Ask yourself: Are my thoughts, words, and actions producing His fruit?

4. You Feel Conviction, Not Condemnation: The Holy Spirit **convicts** you when you drift, ***not to shame, but to restore***. Condemnation comes from the enemy, but conviction comes with ***hope and direction***.

***“When He comes, He will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment.”
— John 16:8***

Ask yourself: Does this voice lead me back to grace or into guilt?

5. You Sense His Gentle Guidance in Decisions: The Spirit often speaks in a **still, small voice**, through impressions, or even closed doors. He can also guide you through circumstances, other believers, or divine timing.

***“Your ears shall hear a word behind you, saying,
‘This is the way, walk in it.’” — Isaiah 30:21***

Ask yourself: Am I open to being redirected, even if it means letting go of my plans?

6. You Desire Holiness More Than Happiness: The Holy Spirit doesn't always lead to comfort, but He always leads to **growth**. When your deepest desire becomes to please God rather than yourself, that's His work within you.

“For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.” — Romans 8:14

Ask yourself: Do I want what God wants, even if it's hard?

Daily Prayer for Guidance

Holy Spirit, be my guide and teacher today. Silence every other voice that competes with Yours. Lead me into truth, peace, and obedience. Help me recognise Your presence in every step I take. **Amen.**

Affirmation:

"I quiet my mind and listen; the Holy Spirit gently leads my heart in truth, peace, and wisdom."

CHAPTER 6.

WHY DO MANY BELIEVERS FAIL TO SEEK THE DIVINE INTERVENTION OF GOD THE HOLY SPIRIT & SUFFER BECAUSE OF IT?

A deep and powerful truth stands clear: many ignore the Spirit's voice they hear. They walk in faith, yet choose control, trusting their strength instead of the soul. They pray with words, but guard the heart, asking for help, yet play their part. And in this struggle, silent and long, they suffer - because they walk alone, not strong.

1. Ignorance of His Presence: Many believers know *about* God and Jesus, but not the ***Holy Spirit personally***. They see Him as a distant power, not as the ***living presence of God within***.

“Do you not know that you are God’s temple and that God’s Spirit dwells in you?” — 1 Corinthians 3:16

When we don’t recognise His indwelling, we try to live a spiritual life with human strength.

2. Relying on Self Instead of Spirit: Some Christians try to solve every problem through ***logic, emotion, or effort*** - forgetting that ***spiritual battles require spiritual strength***.

“Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit, says the Lord.” — Zechariah 4:6

When we ignore the Spirit, we burn out quickly; when we walk with Him, His energy flows through us.

3. Fear of Losing Control: Inviting the Holy Spirit means **surrendering control** -sometimes, many find it uncomfortable. But God's power works best in surrendered hearts.

***“Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom.” -
2 Corinthians 3:17***

Letting go doesn't mean losing control; it means gaining divine direction.

4. Unconfessed Sin or Resistance: The Holy Spirit cannot dwell freely in a heart burdened by **guilt, pride, or unrepentance**.

***“Do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God.” - Ephesians
4:30***

When the heart is cleansed, the Spirit flows like a river of peace.

5. Lack of Daily Relationship: The Spirit doesn't move only in worship services- He desires **daily intimacy**.

***“Walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the
desires of the flesh.” — Galatians 5:16***

*Talk to Him in the morning, listen to Him throughout the day,
and rest in Him at night.*

6. Neglecting the Word: The Holy Spirit **breathes life through Scripture**. Without the Word, His voice is hard to discern.

***“The words I have spoken to you - they are full of
the Spirit and life.” — John 6:63***

When we read the Bible, we don't just study; we listen to the Spirit.

7. The Result of Ignoring the Holy Spirit.

*When we ignore the Holy Spirit's voice,
They trade divine leading for human choice.
Out of ignorance, fear, or need to control,
They silence the whisper that steadies the soul.*

*They lean on logic, rush ahead,
trusting the heart, not where He led.
They fear surrender, resist His hand,
preferring the safety of what they've planned.*

*And slowly the fruit begins to show -
confusion of mind, a restless flow.
Exhaustion settles deep inside,
For strength runs dry when grace is denied.*

*Peace grows distant, joy feels thin,
The war grows loud in the soul within.
Not because God has turned away -
But because His Spirit was ignored that day.*

*For life was never meant to be lived alone,
or carried by flesh and will alone.
When we return, submit, and listen again,
His Spirit restores what fear had drained.*

Without His guidance, many fall into **confusion, exhaustion, and fear** - living a Christian life that feels empty rather than empowered.

But with the Spirit, life becomes **alive, directed, and full of divine energy** - turning pain into purpose and trials into transformation.

“If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit.” - Galatians 5:25

- ☐ I feel the courage to speak or act in truth even when afraid.

- ☐ My actions reflect more of Christ’s love than my own effort.

“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses.” — Acts 1:8

7. Renewal of Mind

- ☐ My thoughts are shifting from fear and doubt to faith and hope.
- ☐ Old habits or desires lose their power over time.
- ☐ I wake each day with a renewed sense of purpose in God.

CHAPTER 7.

1. A Life of Peace -Not Panic

“The mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace.”
— *Romans 8:6*

When the Holy Spirit dwells within you, chaos no longer controls you. Even when storms rise, there’s a **stillness inside** that whispers, **“Be calm, I am with you.”** You stop reacting from fear and start responding from faith. Peace becomes your natural state, not your temporary escape.

Reflection:

When a person lives without the Holy Spirit, life may look **“normal”** on the outside but feels **empty and restless** inside. The body may be alive, but the soul is spiritually dry. The mind becomes restless, the heart becomes heavy, and decisions are driven by emotion instead of divine wisdom.

The absence of the Holy Spirit is not just the absence of peace – it is the absence of purpose and power.

1. A Life of Confusion Instead of Clarity

“For God is not the author of confusion but of peace.” — 1 Corinthians 14:33

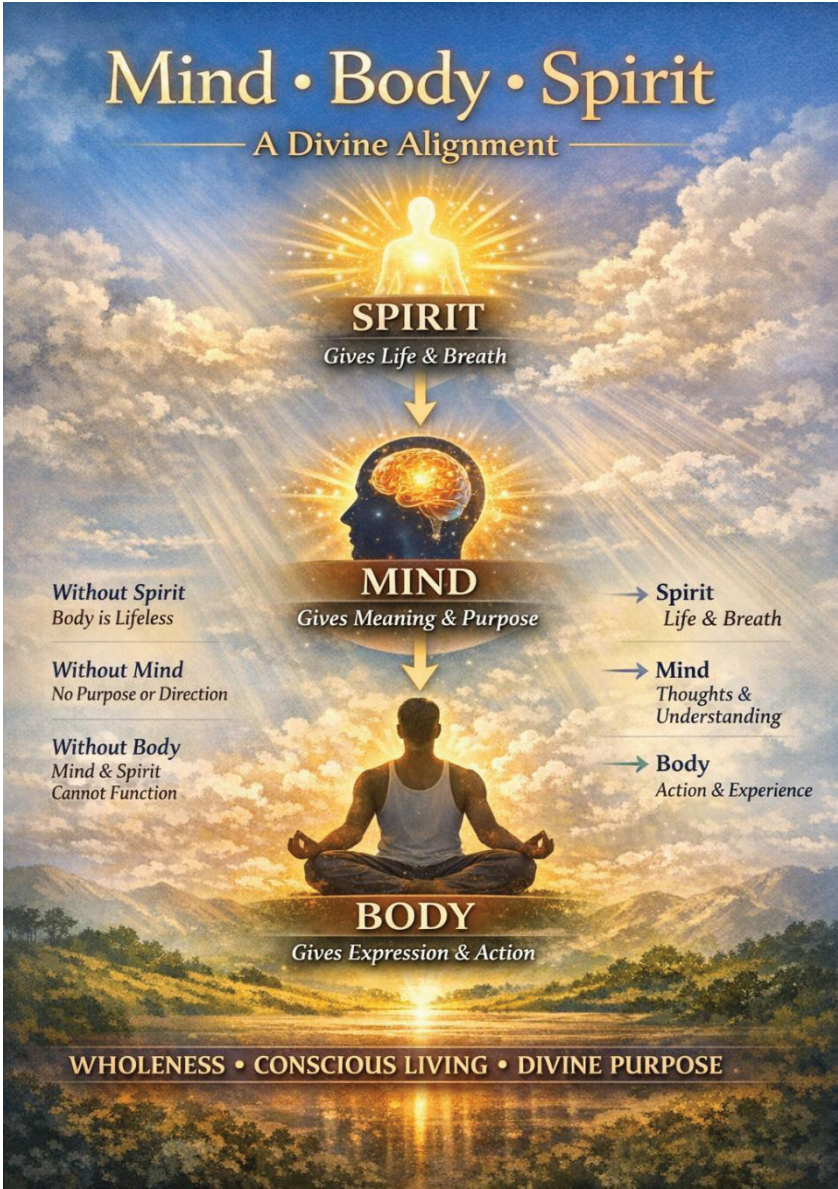
WHO AM I? - MIND - BODY - SPIRIT - A DIVINE ALIGNMENT.

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Chapter 1: Your false identity- Body consciousness.

Chapter 2 .A: Why does Ego hold such a strong position in the world?

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FALSE YOU - BODY CONSCIOUSNESS.

***Body consciousness** weaves a borrowed name,
false identities dressed as fame.
Labels given by the world's loud noise and view,
and sometimes whispered by you too.*

*Slowly, you believe this mask you wear,
mistaking it for truth, for **who you are**.
You call it **real**, you call it **me**,
Yet it's only a shadow, not your; **True you!***

Body consciousness is a state of awareness in which a person identifies primarily with the physical body, external roles, and temporary labels rather than with the eternal soul.

It is the illusion that ***"I am this body"***, defined by appearance, gender, status, success, failure, emotions, possessions, or social identity. When living in body consciousness, the mind becomes driven by ego, comparison, fear, attachment, pride, and insecurity because identity is rooted in what changes.

It measures worth through outer validation and reacts strongly to praise or criticism. In this state, the soul forgets its divine origin and begins to live from survival rather than purpose. Body consciousness limits spiritual awareness, disconnects us from God's presence, and binds us to temporary realities- ***False You.***

It is the opposite of soul consciousness, where identity is anchored in being a divine, eternal child of God rather than a temporary physical form.

CHAPTER 1: YOUR FALSE IDENTITY - BODY CONSCIOUSNESS.

False identity is not something you choose deliberately. It is something you *slowly inherit, absorb, and accept*. Most people are not living as who they truly are- they are living as who *life, pain, society, fear, and expectations* tell them to be.

*“You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.” —

Freedom begins when false identity is **exposed**.

1. Ego Is the Identity of the Fallen Human Nature: Humanity was created to live from the Spirit, in union with God, full of peace, purity, and love. But after the fall, man became separated from God's presence. The Spirit dimmed, and the **flesh took over**. The ego became the new ruler.

Scripture reveals this battle clearly:

“The flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit.”

— *Galatians 5:17*

The flesh (Body consciousness) speaks the language of:

- comparison
- jealousy
- insecurity
- superiority
- self-importance
- self-protection

This is why the ego shows up in every human being who is not spiritually awakened.

2. Pride Is the First Sin Ever to Exist: Before earth, before humanity, there was a rebellion in heaven. Lucifer, a glorious angel, fell not because of immorality... but because of **pride**.

*“Your heart became proud because of your beauty.” —
Ezekiel 28:17*

Pride is ancient. Pride existed *before human sin*. Pride was the original crack in creation. This pride entered the human heart. That is why ego is not just personal, *it is spiritual*.

3. Ego Dominates Because the World Rewards It

Look at the systems of the world:

- Politics rewards dominance
- Business rewards ambition
- Society rewards status
- Entertainment rewards the ego
- Social media rewards image and attention

But Jesus taught the opposite:

*“The greatest among you shall be your servant.” —
Matthew 23:11*

When the world celebrates ego, it spreads like a spiritual virus. The humble are invisible in a proud world. But in the Kingdom of God, the humble are exalted.

4. Ego Gives a False Sense of Power

People cling to ego because it gives the illusion of:

- control

- importance
- superiority
- protection
- identity

The ego is a **mask** that hides the real self. It protects the unhealed places of the heart. But the ego's power is false. Real power comes from the Spirit.

***“Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit.” —
Zechariah 4:6***

5. Ego Is Fueled by Fear and Insecurity. Most ego-driven behaviour comes from fear:

- fear of rejection
- fear of failure
- fear of being insignificant
- fear of being vulnerable
- fear of losing control

The ego says:

***But Scripture teaches: Perfect love casts out fear.- 1 John

- healing cannot happen
- transformation cannot begin

The ego is the greatest spiritual block.

9. Ego Thrives Because the Soul Is Unhealed: Where pain is unhealed, the ego becomes the protector. Where trauma remains, ego becomes the armour. Where wounds exist, the ego builds walls. The ego is the ***bodyguard of the wounded inner child***. This is why the world is full of ego, because the world is full of unhealed hearts. But Jesus came to heal this inner wound:

“He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds.”
— Psalm 147:3

When the heart heals... the ego dissolves.

10. The Path Out of Ego: Surrender, Sacrifice, Service:
Only three spiritual forces destroy the ego:

a. Surrender: Letting go of self-will

“Not my will, but Yours be done.” — Luke 22:42

b. Sacrifice: Laying down the old self

“Present your bodies as a living sacrifice.” —
Romans 12:1

c. Service: Choosing humility and love

“Serve one another in love.” — Galatians 5:13

These three are the doorway out of ego and into divine life.

Summary: Why Ego Is Everywhere?

Because ego is:

- The fallen identity
- The world's operating system
- The oldest spiritual sin
- A mask for fear
- A reaction to wounds

- Rewarded by society
- Unchallenged by the unawakened mind

But spiritual rebirth breaks the ego's power. Only those who awaken in the Spirit return to their true self.

“He must increase, I must decrease.” — John 3:30. This is the anthem of the awakened soul.

CHAPTER 2.

B: WHAT IS EGO DEATH?

Ego death is the process of dissolving the false self (ego) so your true self, **the soul**, can emerge in unity with God. It is not physical death, but the deep inner *dying* of pride, identity attachment, control, and separation from God.

Ego death means:

- Letting go of who you *thought* you were (based on status, pain, roles)
- Breaking the illusion of control, spiritual separation, and self-importance
- Awakening to your *soul identity* and *God's presence* within you

Biblical Example of Ego Death:

“I have been crucified with Christ, and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me.” — Galatians 2:20

Paul speaks of ego death - his ego has *“died,”* and now his true life is in Christ.

Stages of Ego Death

1. **Awakening - Cracking the Shell:** You begin to realise that your outer identity doesn't define you. You feel a deep longing for truth, purpose, and God.
2. **Resistance - Inner Conflict:** The ego resists change. Fear, pride, guilt, and control rise. It feels like a storm inside.

3. **Surrender - Letting Go:** You begin releasing attachments - to people, opinions, control, and the past. You surrender to God's will.
4. **Dark Night of the Soul:** You may feel empty or lost, and old ways no longer work. This is a sacred purification before transformation.
5. **Transformation - Rebirth:** A new awareness awakens. You live more from the soul. Peace, purpose, humility, and love replace fear and ego.
6. **Living as Soul in Union with God:** You walk in light, guided by the Spirit, detached from worldly identity but fully present in divine love.

Prayer for Ego Death:

Oh My Heavenly Father, help me die to pride, control, and fear. Let my false self fall away so that my soul may rise in Your truth. Replace my ego with humility, trust, and surrender. Let Your Spirit be my life. **Amen.**

Affirmation:

"I surrender my ego and let God's truth, humility, and love live through me."

CHAPTER 3: PRIDE - YOUR FALSE IDENTITY.

Pride is not confidence. Pride is not strength. Pride is ***a false identity worn to protect a wounded self***. Most people think pride means arrogance.

But pride often hides behind:

- self-sufficiency
- defensiveness
- superiority
- comparison
- refusal to receive help
- fear of vulnerability

“Pride goes before destruction.” — Proverbs 16:18

Destruction does not come because God punishes pride. It comes because pride **separates us from truth**.

“God has not given us a spirit of fear.” — 2 Timothy 1:7

If fear was not given by God, then fear cannot define you.

1. What Fear Really Is?

Fear is a reaction of the false self trying to stay safe.

To say, **“I am God’s mind”**, does not mean I think independently as God. It means I am invited to **share in His way of thinking**. Left alone, the human mind is restless, reactive, and self-centred. But when surrendered, it becomes renewed, aligned, and Spirit-led.

“We have the mind of Christ.” — 1 Corinthians 2:16

The New You is not just a changed heart - it is a **renewed mind**.

CHAPTER 1: FALSE YOU VS TRUE YOU - BODY CONSCIOUSNESS VS. SOUL CONSCIOUSNESS.

“Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God.”- Colossians 3:2-3

1. Body consciousness is when we identify ourselves **only** with our body- our looks, roles, achievements, status, and material life. It brings:

- Ego, comparison, fear, pride, insecurity.
- A false sense of identity rooted in the temporary.

But you are not the body. You are a soul- eternal, divine light- made in the image of God.

2. Soul consciousness is the awareness that:

- I am ***a soul*** using this body.
- My true identity is ***light, peace, love, and power.***
- I am from the Supreme Soul- My Almighty Father, and I carry His nature.

3. Living in soul consciousness helps us:

- Let go of anger, attachment, fear, and selfishness.
- Express peace, forgiveness, compassion, and clarity.
- Live connected to God, above this world's illusions.

4. Body vs. Soul Consciousness Chart:

Body Consciousness	Soul Consciousness
I am this body	I am a soul in this body
I am what others think of me	I am what God says I am
I need to prove myself	I rest in divine worth

5. Reflection Questions:

6. Activity: Soul Consciousness Meditation

Sit quietly. Close your eyes. Place your hand on your heart and say: ***“I am a soul. I am light. I am at peace. I come from the Father of Light.”*** Visualize a radiant light above (God), and a tiny light inside your forehead glowing with **peace**. Do this for 3–5 minutes daily.

7. Journal Prompts :

“Today, I choose to live as a soul. These are the three qualities I will express...”

Write 3 spiritual qualities (like peace, purity, joy, love, patience) and how you will show them today.

Prayer:

My Supreme Almighty Father, thank You for reminding me that I am not this body- I am a soul. I am light from Your light. Help me rise above ego and illusion. Let me see others not through the body, but as souls too, Your children. Let me live in truth and peace today. **Amen.**

Affirmation:

CHAPTER 2: ALIGNING THE SOUL - WHEN THE INNER WORLD MEETS THE OUTER WORLD.

*“Above all else, guard your heart, for everything
you do flows from it.” — Proverbs 4:23*

We live in two worlds every day:

- **The Outer World:** circumstances, people, roles, noise, opinions, tasks, material needs.
- **The Inner World:** thoughts, feelings, soul awareness, connection with God, peace, virtues.

The **outer world** is constantly changing and out of our control. But the **inner world** is sacred, a temple where God dwells. It is from this space that all actions, words, and decisions begin. When our **inner world is aligned with God**, our outer world becomes **more peaceful**, even if nothing outside changes.

But if our **inner world is filled with anxiety, anger, and confusion**, our outer life feels heavy and restless. We are not meant to be ruled by the outer world. We are called to **master it by nurturing our soul within- the inner world**.

Reflection Questions:

What is the current state of my inner world; peaceful or distracted?

Do I react more to what's outside or respond from within?

What practices help me stay inwardly connected to God?

Activity: Inner-Outer Alignment Practice

1. Draw two circles.
 - Label the **first** “Outer World”, list things that disturb your peace.
 - Label the **second** “Inner World”, write what your soul needs (e.g., silence, forgiveness, prayer, love).
2. Now draw a bridge between the two: How can you bring your soul's peace into your outer life today?

CHAPTER 3.

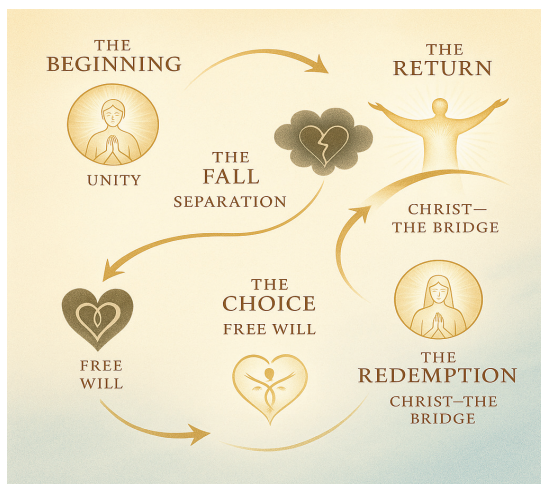
WHAT MADE THE SHIFT THAT CHANGED EVERYTHING? - FROM SOUL CONSCIOUSNESS TO BODY CONSCIOUSNESS.

AN EYE OPENING MOMENT.

In the beginning, humanity lived in perfect harmony with the Almighty Father Our Creator- in *soul consciousness*, radiating peace, love, and divine purity. The soul knew no fear, no comparison, no ego- only *oneness with God*.

“Then God said, ‘Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness.’” — Genesis 1:26

But something changed. Humanity’s focus shifted from **being** to **knowing**, from **connection** to **control**, from **innocence** to **independence**. And that shift; from soul to body consciousness, *is what began the fall*.



1. In the Beginning: The Awakening of Consciousness.

God created the soul as pure light, an image of His divine essence. Adam and Eve walked in soul consciousness; aware of God's presence, clothed in His glory.

But the serpent whispered a new idea- *to know good and evil*, to seek knowledge apart from God. That was the awakening of self-awareness, but also the beginning of *separation*.

They no longer saw themselves as divine reflections but as physical beings, vulnerable and incomplete.

“Then the eyes of both were opened, and they realized they were naked.” — Genesis 3:7

Reflection: When did I start seeing myself through fear, comparison, or shame; instead of through God's light?

2. The Fall: From Being to Becoming: When humanity shifted from soul to body consciousness, everything changed. We moved from *living in God's presence* to *searching for God's presence*.

Our mind became filled with duality;

- good vs. evil,
- right vs. wrong,
- love vs. fear.

The world of simplicity became a world of striving. The stillness of the spirit became the restlessness of the self. The voice of the soul became drowned by the noise of the ego.

***“For the flesh desires what is contrary to the Spirit,
and the Spirit what is contrary to the flesh.” —***

Galatians 5:17

Reflection: Do I live to prove myself; or to express my true self?

3. The Rise of Ego, Fear, and Judgment: Once the soul identified with the body, new emotions emerged;

- Fear of loss.
- Shame of imperfection.
- Pride of possession.

The **“I”** replaced the **“We.”** Humanity started seeing division;

- man vs. woman,
- self vs. others,
- creation vs. Creator.

And yet, even in the fall, God’s love never left. He clothed them, spoke to them, and promised a Redeemer; ***a bridge back to soul consciousness through Christ.***

***“The Lord God made garments of skin for Adam
and his wife and clothed them.” — Genesis 3:21***

Reflection: Do I identify more with my outer identity (name, role, image) or with my inner being; ***the soul?***

4. The Gift of Free Will: The Choice Between Good and Evil: God gave humanity a divine privilege; *A Choice*. Even after the fall, the door to return to the light was never closed. Every thought, word, and deed became an opportunity to return home; to choose:

- love over fear,
- faith over doubt,
- light over darkness.

“I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life.” — Deuteronomy 30:19

Reflection: What choices today reflect my connection to God; and which separate me from Him?

5. The Restoration: Returning to Soul Consciousness: Through **Christ**, the bridge between separation and unity was rebuilt. He came not only to redeem the body but to reawaken the soul; to restore humanity to its original consciousness: *peace, truth, and divine love*.

“For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive.” — 1 Corinthians 15:22

True redemption is not just forgiveness; it's about **reconnection**. It's the awakening of soul consciousness again; living as light in a world of shadows.

Reflection: Do I live as a soul having a human experience; or as a human searching for a soul?

Prayer For Restoration.

My Heavenly Almighty Father, Restore in me the purity of soul You created in the beginning. Remove my layers of fear, ego, and separation. Let me live again in Your consciousness; to see through light, to speak with truth, and to love without condition. May my life become a reflection of Your eternal peace. **Amen.**

Affirmation:

I am a soul - light of the Supreme Soul. I live from being - not from becoming. My essence is peace, my purpose is love. God's image in me - can never be lost - only forgotten. I return daily to my original state - soul consciousness.

CHAPTER 4: HOW TO REGAIN SOUL CONSCIOUSNESS?

Returning to Eden: Living Again in Soul Consciousness.

Regaining **soul consciousness** means awakening your true identity as a soul; a being of light, peace, and divinity, rather than being absorbed in body, ego, roles, and external things. It is about **returning to your original nature** and **reconnecting with God**, the Supreme Soul.

“Be still, and know that I am God.” – Psalm 46:10

1. Daily Stillness and Silence (Meditative Prayer): Begin and end your day with 5–10 minutes of silence.

- Sit quietly, close your eyes.
- Say to yourself: ***I am a soul; a point of light. I am not this body. I am eternal. God is the Supreme Soul; my Divine Father. I am connected to Him.***

Let this thought become your identity.

2. Detach from Role and Ego: Throughout your day, pause and reflect:

- *Am I reacting as a role (mother, worker, student)?*
- *Or am I responding as a soul (peaceful, loving, conscious)?*

Repeat inwardly: ***I am not in this role. I am a peaceful soul acting through this role.***

3. Connect with the Supreme Soul: The more you remember God, the more you shine. Talk to Him not as a far-away God, but as your **Heavenly Father**, the **Ocean of**

Peace and ever near. Use the affirmation: ***“I, the soul, draw light from the Supreme Light.”***

4. Choose Virtue Over Reaction: When anger, pride, or fear arise, **Pause.** Don’t react from body consciousness. **Ask:** What would a soul do right now?

- Choose peace.
- Choose forgiveness.
- Choose the truth.

5. Study Spiritual Truths Daily: Feed your soul just as you feed your body. Read Holy Bible scriptures, wisdom texts, or soul-based reflections. Example:

- The body is dust, but the soul is eternal.
- God is Spirit, and so am I

Memory Verse: *The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God’s children.* — *Romans 8:16*

Reflection Questions:

What takes me away from soul consciousness?

When did I last feel completely at peace within?

What steps will I take daily to live more as a soul?

Reflection Activity: Soul Mirror: Stand before a mirror, look into your eyes and repeat: ***"I am a soul. I am light. I am peaceful. I am loved. I am eternal."*** Let your inner light awaken.

Prayer: Living Again in Soul Consciousness.

My Heavenly Father, I return to You; to the place of peace where I belong. Help me live not from ego, but from soul. Teach me to see through spiritual eyes, to act from Your love, and to remember who I truly am. Let my soul shine in Your presence. **Amen.**

CHAPTER 5.

DAILY PRACTICE - SOUL AWAKENING MEDITATION.

Early Morning Soul Power Meditation- Begin the day with divine energy and light from the Supreme Source.

Time: 5:30 AM – 6:30 AM (or anytime before sunrise)

Duration: 10–20 minutes

Posture: Sit comfortably, in a clean and calm space.

1. Centering the Soul: Affirmation (whisper or repeat silently):

Breathe in peace...Breathe out all heaviness...Let your mind become still and silent.

- **Power to Love** – unconditionally and soulfully

Repeat: *“I receive Your strength, O Father. Fill me with light for today’s journey.”*

4. Visualize Your Day in Light: See yourself moving through your day with **calm, clarity, and confidence**. Every meeting, task, and moment is filled with divine guidance. Every challenge is already infused with light and victory.

5. Scripture Reflection

CHAPTER 1.

SPIRITUAL SEPARATION - DISTANCE FROM ALMIGHTY GOD.

Spiritual separation from God is not a physical distance, nor is it God abandoning His children. It is an inner condition of the soul; a state where the heart no longer senses God's presence, the mind no longer hears His voice clearly, and the spirit feels dry, restless, or empty. This separation is often silent. Life may continue outwardly as normal, yet inwardly there is a sense of loss; a missing connection with the Source of life.

“Your iniquities have separated you from your God.” —

Isaiah 59:2

1. What Is Spiritual Separation?

Spiritual separation is the disconnection between the human spirit and God's presence, caused not by God's withdrawal but by ***human choices, inner misalignment, and spiritual drift.***

It happens when:

- The spirit stops leading.
- The mind becomes dominant without truth.
- The flesh gains control.
- The heart grows distant.

The soul still exists; but it no longer thrives.

2. God Never Leaves: We Drift Away: God's nature is constant. His love does not change.

CHAPTER 4.

WHEN THE LOGICAL MIND AWAKENS - SEPARATION FROM GOD BEGINS - BUT LOVE BUILDS THE BRIDGE BACK HOME.

*Understanding How Human Reasoning Creates Distance,
and How God Restores Us Through the Power of Choice;
Between Birth and Death, the Choice Is Ours.*

There are two kinds of awakening: **the awakening of the spirit (soul consciousness)** and **the awakening of the logical mind (body consciousness)**. The awakening of the spirit draws you toward God. The awakening of the logical mind often draws you away from Him.

The mind is a gift; but when it becomes independent from God, it becomes a barrier instead of a blessing. Spiritual separation begins when the logical mind tries to understand spiritual things without the Spirit.

Even though our logical mind has awakened and often leads us toward reasoning, independence, and self-reliance, our **Almighty Father loves us still; deeply, patiently, and unconditionally.**

He did not remove our freedom; instead, He honored us with **the sacred gift of choice.** We are not forced to live blindly or obediently; we are invited. And with the help of the Holy Spirit, we are empowered **to choose not just what is good in the eyes of the world, but what is best in the eyes of God.**

In every moment, every decision, and every crossroads, His Spirit whispers, guides, and strengthens us so we may **choose**

His will, His way, and His truth; not out of compulsion, but out of love and alignment.

1. The Logical Mind Was Never Designed to Replace God

God gave us:

- a mind to reason,
- a heart to love,
- and a spirit to connect with Him.

But when the **mind takes control over spirit**, sin begins. This is what happened in Eden.

CHAPTER 5.

A SPIRITUAL BLINDNESS - A BARRIER BETWEEN YOU AND GOD.

A. The Silent Darkness That Blocks Truth, Hides Purpose, Dulls Discernment, and Prevents the Soul From Seeing the Light of God.

There is no suffering greater than the suffering of a spiritually blind soul. It is not a blindness of the eyes; *it is a blindness of the heart, the mind, and the spirit.*

Spiritual blindness keeps you:

- far from God
- lost in self
- trapped in darkness
- restless in the soul
- confused in purpose
- disconnected from truth
- unable to discern
- living without spiritual direction

It is the most dangerous condition a human soul can live in; because you may think you are seeing, but you are actually walking in darkness. *Spiritual blindness is the greatest barrier between you and God.*

1. What Is Spiritual Blindness?

Spiritual blindness is the inability to:

- see God clearly
- sense His presence
- hear His voice

- understand His will
- discern truth from lies
- recognize your own sin
- see your true identity
- perceive spiritual danger

It is living with eyes open but the soul asleep. You function in the world, but fail to function in the Spirit.

“Though seeing, they do not see; though hearing, they do not hear.”— Matthew 13:13

This is spiritual blindness.

2. Where Does Spiritual Blindness Come From?

CHAPTER 7.

WHAT IS SOUL SUFFERING?- A SPIRITUAL DISTRESS.

A SPIRITUAL DISTRESS BRINGS SPIRITUAL DISTANCE.

Soul suffering is *a profound emotional and spiritual distress*, often described as a sense of disconnection from one's true self, the divine, or a feeling of deep, unfulfilled longing, rather than a physical pain.

Soul suffering is **deep, invisible pain** experienced at the spiritual level. It's not just emotional or mental distress; it's the *inner disconnection from peace, love, truth, and purpose*. It comes when the **soul forgets its true nature** and *its connection* to the Supreme Soul (God).

Causes of Soul Suffering:

1. **Body-conscious living:** Identifying with ego, roles, appearance, or material success.
2. **Unhealed emotional wounds:** Rejection, betrayal, guilt, or grief that we carry silently.
3. **Disconnection from God:** Forgetting the soul's true Father, Source, and Guide.
4. **Negative karma or inner conflict:** Regret, shame, or living against inner truth.
5. **Lack of spiritual nourishment:** No silence, prayer, virtue practice, or divine remembrance.

HOW TO HEAL SOUL SUFFERING - A SPIRITUAL PROCESS.

1. Awaken to Soul Consciousness

“I am not this body or pain; I am a soul, a child of God.”

Sit daily in silence and practice remembering who you truly are: ***a soul, pure and eternal.***

2. Connect with the Supreme Soul- Our Almighty Father.

“The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit.” – Psalm 34:18

In meditation, visualize divine light pouring into your soul; healing your wounds, dissolving darkness.

3. Cleanse through Spiritual Reflection and Forgiveness

- Write or speak to God: ***“Here is my pain. I cannot carry it anymore. Please take it.”***

Let Your love restore what suffering has shaken, and lead it from darkness into quiet hope. **Amen.**

Affirmation:

"I acknowledge my pain, but I am not defined by it. Even in deep emotional and spiritual distress, my soul is held in divine love. I am not alone in this journey. Healing is unfolding within me, gently and steadily. Light is entering the places that once felt dark. I am supported, restored, and becoming whole again."

CHAPTER 8.

SPIRITUAL WHOLENESS - SOUL HEALING JOURNEY FROM RESTORATION TO RECONNECTION.

Examples of soul healing from the Bible, showing **how God restores, heals, and reconnects** people to their spiritual wholeness:

Day 1: I Am a Soul, Not This Body

“The body returns to the dust... the spirit returns to God who gave it.” — Ecclesiastes 12:7

Day 6: Reconnecting Through Remembrance: The more you remember God, the more you become like Him. This remembrance is called *“spiritual Connection”* linking the soul with its Source.

“You will keep in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast, because they trust in You.” — Isaiah 26:3

Activity: Every time you say your name today, silently also say: *“I am a soul, child of the Supreme Soul.”*

Journaling Prompt: How can I build constant remembrance into my daily life?

Prayer: My Father, let Your remembrance be my breath. Let me walk hand in hand with You all day long.

Day 7: Living a Soul-Conscious Life Daily: Soul consciousness is not a moment; *it’s a way of life*. When you live as a soul, you become *peaceful, purposeful, and powerful*.

CHAPTER 9.

GROWTH MARKERS OF NEW YOU - A PURE HEART - THE MIRROR OF GOD'S LIGHT.

“How does a pure heart look like?”

A pure heart is not defined by **perfection**, but by **presence**; it is the heart that reflects God's light without distortion. The *New You* is the heart that **feels deeply, forgives freely, and serves humbly**.

“Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.” — Matthew 5:8

5. A Pure Heart Is Peaceful: It doesn’t fight to control or worry about tomorrow. It rests in trust; knowing that everything happens under divine wisdom. Such a heart glows with serenity, even in storms.

“The peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.” — Philipians 4:7

Reflection: When was the last time I truly rested in God’s peace without fear?

6. A Pure Heart Radiates Light: Wherever it goes, it uplifts. Its presence brings calm, and its words bring healing. It doesn’t speak loudly, but it speaks truth that awakens souls.

“The unfolding of Your words gives light; it gives understanding to the simple.” — Psalm 119:130

Reflection: Do people feel peace or tension when they meet me?

CHAPTER 10.

GROWTH MARKERS OF NEW YOU - A SURRENDERED HEART - THE BEAUTY OF LETTING GO & LETTING GOD LEAD YOU.

A **surrendered heart** is not weak, it is **strong in trust** and **gentle in spirit**. It is the heart that no longer fights to control life, people, or outcomes; but quietly says,

“Father, not my will, but Yours be done.” — Luke 22:42

A surrendered heart doesn't mean giving up on life; it means giving life **back** to the One who gave it. It stops striving and starts trusting. It learns that peace is found not in having everything, but in **yielding everything**.

1. A Surrendered Heart Is Peaceful: Even in chaos, a surrendered heart remains calm because it knows **God is in control**. It doesn't rush, worry, or manipulate. It rests.

CHAPTER 12:

It's **gentle, deep, and personal**. You know God is intervening when something inside you is no longer the same.

CHAPTER 13:

TRANSFORMATION OF NEW YOU IS A PROCESS - BUT THERE IS A SECRET TO ACCELERATE THE NEW YOU - A NEW CREATION.

The New You is not formed in a moment. It is formed through a process. Transformation is not sudden because *the soul must be renewed, the mind must be aligned, and the heart must be restored*. What took years to build in the old self cannot disappear overnight. God does not rush transformation. He builds it *carefully, deeply, and permanently*.

“He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion.” — Philippians 1:6

The New You is not an event. It is a divine process of restoration and alignment.

CHAPTER 2.

A NEW YOU - A NEW LIFE.

ROMANS 8: LIFE THROUGH THE SPIRIT.

**No Condemnation • No Separation • A New Identity • A
New Power • A New Life**

Romans 8 is considered the crown jewel of the New Testament; the chapter of *New You: freedom, identity, power, and assurance*.

It shows how the Holy Spirit transforms the believer from the inside out; from a life of weakness to a life of *spiritual strength, purity, and intimacy with God*.

This chapter explains how to live a Spirit-led life, how to overcome the flesh, and how to walk as God's beloved child.

1. NO CONDEMNATION IN CHRIST; THE WAR IS OVER

“There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.” — Romans 8:1

- God does not condemn you.
- Your past cannot condemn you.
- Your sin cannot condemn you.
- The enemy cannot condemn you.
- Even your own conscience cannot condemn you.

Why?

- Because the price has been paid. The wrath has been removed. The blood has spoken.

- You are free, not because you are perfect, but because Christ is perfect.
- This is the beginning of Spirit-led living, Freedom from guilt.

2. THE LAW OF THE SPIRIT SETS YOU FREE FROM THE LAW OF SIN

“The law of the Spirit of life has set you free from the law of sin and death.” — Romans 8:2

There are two spiritual laws:

“The mind controlled by the flesh is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace.” — Romans 8:6

SURRENDER, SACRIFICE & SERVICE.

*Becoming Spiritually Awake, Fully Surrendered, Joyfully
Sacrificial, and Eternally Useful to God.*

There are three stages of spiritual awakening; three doors that open the soul into the fullness of God: **SURRENDER**, **SACRIFICE**, and **SERVICE**.

A believer's life changes the moment the soul awakens to these divine realities. Surrender aligns your **WILL** with God. Sacrifice aligns your **HEART** with God. Service aligns your **LIFE** with God.

When all three combine, you live in **divine awakening**; a life where your soul is alive, your spirit is on fire, and your purpose shines.

1. Divine Awakening Begins With Surrender: Surrender is the gateway to spiritual awakening. It is the moment your soul moves from self-rule to God-rule.

“Not my will, but Yours be done.”— Luke 22:42

Surrender awakens the soul by:

- Removing pride
- Breaking the ego
- Silencing self-reliance
- Opening your spirit to God's voice
- Allowing divine direction to flow

A surrendered soul is no longer driven by:

- Fear
- Ambition
- Emotion
- People's approval

A surrendered soul is led by the Spirit. Surrender is not defeat; it is the beginning of divine victory.

CHAPTER 6.

A NEW YOU - LIVING A GODLY LIFE

A CHRIST-LIKE CHARACTER.

The New You is not defined by appearance, status, or external success. **The New You** is revealed through **character**. **Christ-like character** is the visible expression of inner transformation. It is not something you pretend to have, it is something that grows naturally when your heart, mind, and spirit align with God.

“Whoever claims to live in Him must live as Jesus did.” — 1 John 2:6

The New You does not merely believe in Christ. The New You begins to **reflect Christ**.

1. Christ-Like Character Begins with Inner Transformation: Character is not formed by external pressure. It is formed by internal renewal. When your soul is restored, your nature begins to change. You begin to respond differently, think differently, and live differently; not by force, but by alignment.

“Be transformed by the renewing of your mind.” — Romans 12:2

Transformation begins inside and becomes visible outside.

2. Christ-Like Character Reflects Love: Love becomes your foundation. Not conditional love, but unconditional love; love that forgives, understands, and restores.

DAILY PRACTICE - A SOUL AWAKENING MEDITATION.

Time: 10–15 minutes - early morning or evening.

Space: Quiet, peaceful space

Step 1: Prepare the Heart

Affirm aloud or silently:

*“I am not this body. I am a soul. A tiny light of the Supreme
Light.”*

Breathe in slowly. Breathe out gently. Let go of tension from your shoulders, chest, and face. Close your eyes and bring your awareness to your inner world.

Step 2: Visualization:

Imagine a **tiny radiant light**, like a star, glowing gently at the center of your forehead. This is **you**, the soul. **Pure. Eternal. Divine.** Now visualize a **great Light**, the Supreme Soul- Your Almighty Father, shining high above in a realm beyond space and time. This Light is full of **love, wisdom, and peace**. You are connected to this **Light - always**.

Step 3: Soul Affirmations (repeat slowly)

- *“I am a peaceful soul.”*

- *“I am a child of God, full of love and light.”*
- *“I release all fear, all burden, all ego.”*
- *“I am awakening to my divine nature.”*

Step 4: Bible Verse Reflection

Let this verse echo within you. Imagine God’s light searching and healing your inner parts.

Step 5: Connection to the Trinity:

Feel the **love of the Father**, the **redemption of the Son**, and the **presence of the Holy Spirit** surrounding and filling you. You are not alone. **The Trinity is awakening your true self.**

Step 6: Closing Prayer:

Oh My Supreme Father, awaken me from within. Let me walk as a soul, not as a mask. Let me remember who I truly am, and why I am here. Lead me into the light of Your presence. **Amen.**

Step 7: Affirmation for the entire day: Pause often and Say,

“I am a soul... a divine spark of light... eternal... peaceful.... Almighty father is dwelling in me.”

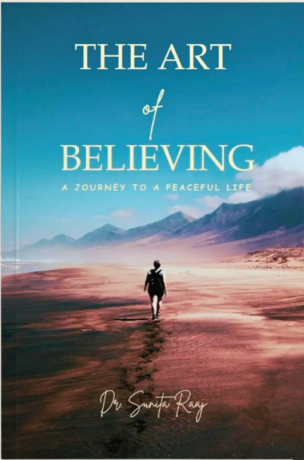
